The University of Illinois

The University of Illinois, chartered in 1867, welcomed its first class in 1868. The U of I has been the catalyst of many changes and advances. Revolutionary inventions, such as the transistor, nylon and the portable kidney dialysis machine are credited to U of I graduates and researchers; and more business executives are alumni of the U of I than any other public university in the country.

These are a few points of pride:

- 17 alumni and faculty are Nobel prize winners.
- Urbana's library is the largest public university library in the world.
- Illinois has four major research universities — UIC and Urbana-Champaign are two of them.
- Springfield accounting graduates have earned 13 EXCEL awards — more than six times the national average.

The University is on the go. In Chicago, a new MRI device will be the largest, most powerful one in the world, allowing researchers to see microscopic activity on a level never achieved before. Urbana is quickly filling space at its new tech park. And Springfield welcomed its first class of freshmen in August 2001.

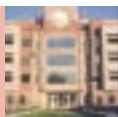

Student Financial Aid

Financial aid of nearly \$502 million assisted U of I students in 1999-2000. Approximately 128,112 awards were made to 40,502 students in Chicago, Springfield and Urbana-Champaign. "Gift" aid, including scholarships, grants, fellowships, and tuition and fee waivers, accounted for 42 percent of the total. Employment and loans covered 58 percent. Students earned more than \$117 million from University-related jobs in 1999-2000.

Programs such as the Great Cities Institute are actively involved in searching for solutions to the social, economical and health concerns of the region.

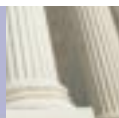

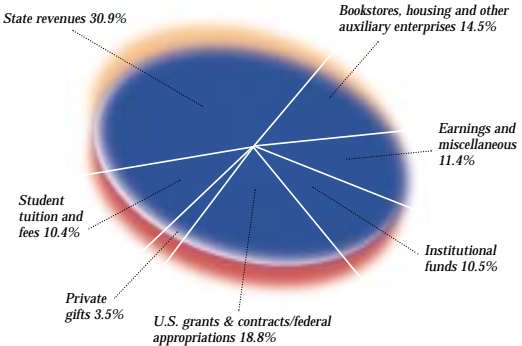

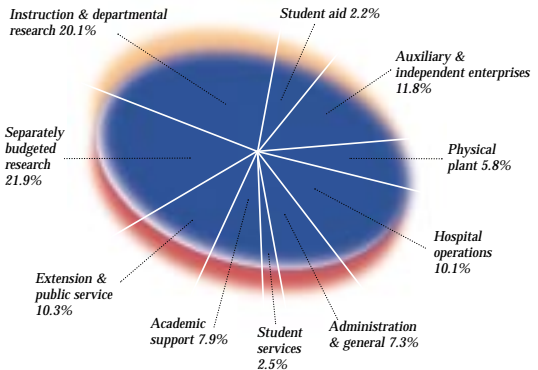

how is the money spent?

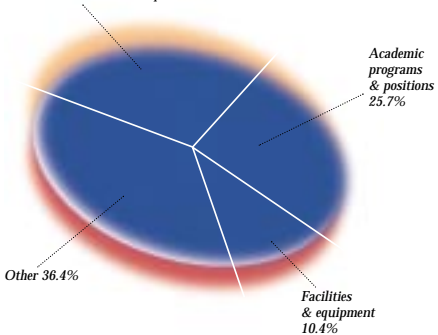


Campaign Illinois

The University of Illinois was one of the first public institutions to set an ambitious goal of raising \$1 billion in private funds. Campaign Illinois not only met that challenge, but surpassed the goal months ahead of schedule. At the end of Campaign Illinois as of December 31, 2000, gifts and pledges totaled \$1,529,295,874.
