### ASSESSMENT REPORT FOR Group 2: Cycle 1 - Fall 2017 - Fall 2019

#### Mission Statement

The mission of the College of Nursing is to provide nationally recognized educational programs and advances science, practice, and policy to optimize health for all.

#### Goal 1.

1. Apply scientific and theoretical knowledge to the practice of advanced nursing in the clinical or leadership emphasis areas.

#### Curriculum

- Learning Outcome 1: Completion of all graduate core, and advanced practice core and specialty coursework and clinical hours for clinical or leadership emphasis areas required for eligibility for current advanced practice nursing certification or licensure. For clinical emphasis area, NURS 793, 796, or 798. For leadership emphasis area, NURS 806 & 807.

#### Learning Outcome 1.

Apply scientific and theoretical knowledge to the practice of advanced nursing in the clinical or leadership emphasis areas.

#### Measures and Criteria

80% or greater of the DNP students will complete supervised clinical practice hours and/or clinical case study presentation in NURS 793 (FNP students), 796 (AG-ACNP students); 798 (PMHNP students) or 806 and/or 807 (DNP Nurse Executive students) demonstrating advanced practice nursing proficiency or Leadership competencies (3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale) on the clinical evaluation tools, completed by the preceptor at the end of the course

80% or greater of the students completing a national specialty certification exams will pass.

#### Methods

1. NP Clinical Faculty and preceptors provide direct observation of clinical practice with each NP student in each NP clinical course at least twice per semester. Preceptors evaluate NP students daily and submit a written evaluation to the course faculty member at midterm and at the end of the semester. NP clinical faculty share results with the Program Director each semester. Outcomes are reviewed in a program directors meeting (April or May) and recommendations are made to DNP Academic Council the following fall semester.

Certifying Agencies share National Certification Pass Rates for NP examinees with CON administrators who shares with program directors annually. Data are stored on K drive. Pass rates are monitored using a newly designed NP tracking system. Analyses is done by the program directors in April/May with recommendations shared with DNP Council in the following fall semester.

#### Results

For the Fall 2017-2019 time frame, the following results were obtained:

NURS793: 100% 1st attempt pass of clinical course objectives (n=232)

NURS796: 100% 1st attempt pass of clinical course objectives (n=75)

NURS798: 100% 1st attempt pass of clinical case study presentation objectives (n=50)

NURS806: 100% 1st attempt pass of leadership competency objectives (n=9)

For the 2018 reporting year, the national certification pass rates for first time certificate for FNP, AGACNP & PMHNP program graduates on first attempt was 100%

For nursing leadership, there is no required certification exam (optional) at this time.

### **Use of Results**

The speciality program directors review course and end of program evaluation results at the conclusion of each semester. Recommendations are brought forward from program directors to the CON DNP academic council for consideration. The current cycle results exceeded the benchmark. The plan is to continue the current course plans and monitor results.

### **Learning Outcome 2.**

Adopt a population health perspective in the analysis of health needs and design of interventions for individuals, families, and communities; and in striving to meet national and global health care goals.

### **Measures and Criteria**

80% or greater of the students enrolled in N708 will successfully conduct a population assessment with epidemiological data as evidenced by a grade of 85% or greater on the health promotion project proposal in written and virtual formats at completion of the course.

### **Methods**

1. The NURS 708 faculty posts the assignment, grading rubric criteria. The aggregate data are collected by the NURS 708 faculty and reported to the graduate council for curriculum and/or assessment revision in the fall of every year. The NURS 708 faculty are responsible for grading assignments,

### **Use of Results**

The NURS708 faculty review the end of course evaluations each semester along with the DNP academic council evaluation committee. Recommendations are brought forward to the DNP academic council for consideration. The current cycle results exceeded the benchmark. The plan is to continue the current course project and monitor results.

### **Measures and Criteria**

1. 85% of the students enrolled in the DNP capstone project course (NURS 897) will receive a satisfactory score on capstone presentation and manuscript development. The DNP Capstone project focus is on a significant issue in clinical practice or executive leadership. The DNP project measures one's ability to accurately analyze scientific evidence and theoretical perspectives as a basis for practice improvement, policy development, and further research; ability to analyze and synthesize. The DNP project demonstrates doctoral level writing skills. The DNP Project Chair monitors the assignment timelines and due dates and is

responsible for student grading.

### **Methods**

The DNP project committee chair completes the evaluation at the end of the NURS 897 course, evaluating the presentation and manuscript. A new rubric form is under development. The results are returned to the Program Director who aggregates the outcomes and recommends changes if needed to the graduate council at the end of each semester.

### **Results**

For the Fall 2017-2019 time frame, the following results were obtained:

NURS897: 95% 1st attempt pass of the DNP project (n=23)

#### **Use of Results**

The DNP program directors review the end of program evaluations each semester along with the DNP academic council evaluation committee. Recommendations are brought forward to the DNP academic council for consideration regarding the DNP project. The DNP project process was updated in summer 2019 after student input regarding the process and streamlined the project steps. The current cycle results exceeded the benchmark. The plan is to continue the current course project and monitor results.

1. 80% of all students enrolled in the N734 will earn a minimum score of 85% on health systems strategic plan assignment using the attached rubric by the end of course.

1. NURS 734 faculty of record analyzes individual and aggregate data on final health systems strategic plan project in NURS 734.

#### **Results**

For the Fall 2017-2019 time frame, the following results were obtained:

NURS734: 100% 1st attempt pass of the strategic plan project (n=99)

The NURS 779 Faculty member of record is responsible for student grading, aggregate analysis, and presentation of findings to the DNP Council for recommendations/revisions of assessment or curriculum.
